
- Depending on the shape of the computer monitor port, it may not be possible to make connections with the accessory computer cable. Please convert it using a commercially available adapter, etc.
- Connect the second computer to the [Computer2] port when two computers are to be connected. Use the computer cable (mini D-Sub 15pin/5BNC) supplied with the projector for this connections.

* Turn off the power for both the projector and the other equipment before connecting them.



- 1 Remove the lens cover.
- 2 Connect the power cord to the projector.
- 3 Connect the power cord to an electrical outlet.






If a laptop computer or a computer with a LCD screen has been connected to the projector, you may need to change the output destination for image signals depending on the computer keys (The and other displays are situated on the computer keys) or the computer's settings. The output destination can normally be changed by holding down the computer's Fn and pressing one of the Function keys. Once the source has been changed, after a short wait the projector will start projecting. If the output has been changed to external output, only the external output should be used. For details, refer to the documentation provided with your computer.




🖔 Tip

- If you change the projection angle, you may get keystone distortion in the images. You can use the Keystone on the projector's control panel to correct keystone distortion.
- To store the extended front feet, pull up the foot adjust lever and then slowly lower the front panel.

Adjusting the projection angle

Lift the front of the projector while pulling up the foot adjust lever, adjust the amount extension or retraction of the front foot, then adjust the projector's projection angle.



Press (-) on the operation panel or open the cover on the remote control and press (-) to automatically adjust the tracking, the display position and the synchronization.








Other adjustments

Correcting keystone distortion Page 38 of Owner's Manual




- When keystone correction is carried out, the projected image will become smaller.
- The trapezoid correction state is recorded in memory. Please readjust it when the projection angle is changed.
- If the images become uneven in appearance after keystone correction is carried out, decrease the Sharpness setting.



Turning Off the Projector



Turn off the power for the equipment connected to the projector.

⊍ Power


Press the twice to turn off the projector's power.

Press once to display the confirmation message in order to prevent miss-operations.

Press it once more to switch off the power supply. It is possible to switch off the power supply by pressing twice consecutively.


The \bigcirc will start flashing orange. (Cool-down in progress)






Using the remote control for one-person presentations

The remote control can be used to carry out the same functions as left-clicking and right-clicking mouse buttons on a computer. You can use the remote control to control the computer's mouse pointer from a distance.







Press 5 to erase the stamps, squares, spotlights and bars set for decorative purposes.


Enhancing presentation materials

Press 1.




Displays the stamp icon. The stamp icon will switch between three different types whenever is pressed. Tilt the to to move the stamp icon, and then press to stamp the stamp icon in position.

Press 3.




Displays the spotlight. The spotlight will switch between three different sizes whenever 3 is pressed. Tilt to move the spotlight.

Press 2.



Displays the square icon. Tilt the to move the icon to the starting point, and then press Tilt the again to move the icon to the ending position, and then press .


Press 4.



Displays the bar. The bar will switch between three different types whenever 4 is pressed. Tilt up and down to move the bar.







Enlarging part of projected images

Press **E-Zoom** to enlarge the image being projected.

Tilt the on the remote control to scroll to the area that is to be viewed.





Momentarily turning off images and sound

The A/V Mute function momentarily pauses the image and sound, and displays either a blank blue or black screen or the user's logo screen. It can be used when you do not want to show viewers details of operations such as selecting different files when computer images are being projected.

Press (A/V Mute).



Press (AV Mute) once more.

Projection of the images and sound will be restarted.

If you use this function while projecting moving images, the images and sound will still continue to be played back, and you cannot return to the point where the A/V Mute function was activated.

Menu

First press the , select "Setting" and then "A/V Mute". Then select the type of screen to be displayed when projection is being stopped. The following choices are available. The default setting is the black screen.














Checking the indicators

The projector is equipped with indicators that alert you to problems with projector operation.

The following tables show what the indicators mean and how to remedy problems that they indicate.



Lamp Indicator	
Indicator status	Problem and remedy
Blinking in Red	Lamp error. Remove the lamp and check if it is broken. If the lamp is not broken, reinstall it. If the lamp is broken, replace it with a new lamp. *2
Blinking in Orange	Nearing the time for replacing the lamp. Prepare a new lamp. *2
Extinguished	The power has not been switched on or normal projection is in progress.

Operation Indicator		
Indicator status	Problem and remedy	
Illuminated in Orange	Standby condition. This is the only time when the power cord can be disconnected. Projection will start a few moments after has been pressed.	
Blinking in Orange	Cool-down in progress. After while, the projector switches to the standby condition (the indicator lights orange).	
Illuminated in Green	Projecting in progress.	
Blinking in Green	Warm-up in progress. After warm-up is complete, projection will start when an image signal is input.	
Blinking in Red	Internal problem. Stop using the projector and ask for projector to be repaired. *1	
Extinguished	The power is not switched on.	

Temperature Indicator	
Indicator status	Problem and remedy
Illuminated in Red	Excessive internal temperature (overheating). The lamp goes off automatically and projection becomes impossible. Wait for approximately 5 minutes with the projector in that state. After 5 minutes has passed, pull out the power plug and re-insert it. After re-inserting it, press the and turn on the power again.
Blinking in Red	Internal problem. Stop using the projector and ask for projector to be repaired. *1
Blinking in Orange	High-speed cooling in progress. If the internal temperature rises any higher, projection will stop. Check that the air inlet and exhaust vents are clear and that the indoor temperature is not too high.
Extinguished	The power has not been switched on or normal projection is in progress.
